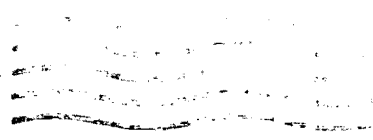
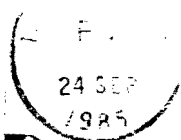

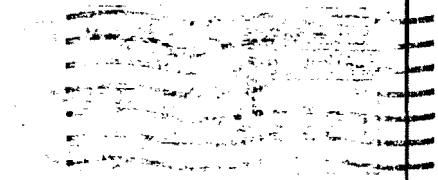

The University Library's first volumes were acquired in Fall 1957, the year before the first students were enrolled. The millionth volume is the first Spanish Edition (1796) of Real Cedula, popularly known as the Pinckney's Treaty; this treaty negotiated the northern boundaries of Florida and opened the Mississippi to America trade. Mary Lou Harkness joined the University Library staff in 1958 and has been Director of Libraries since 1967.

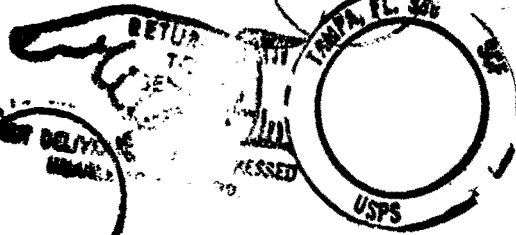
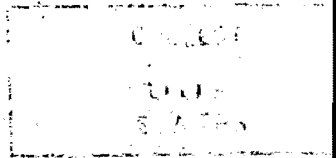
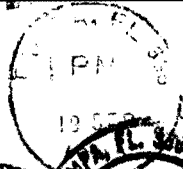

NOTICE OF PROPOSED BYLAW CHANGES

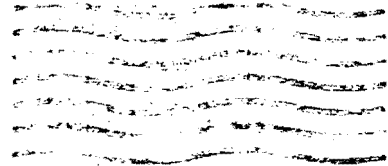

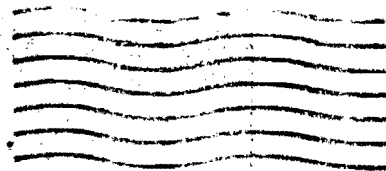

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:10 a.m.

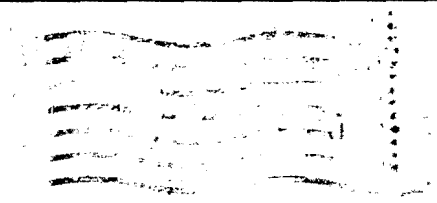

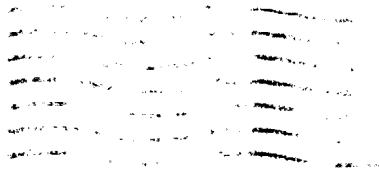
