One morning we were surprised to find circus elephants walking down Water Street by the Tampa Bay Times Forum. Another time we watched dragon boat races. What an interesting place to exercise! The Convention Center is headquarters for car shows, home shows, volleyball tournaments, cheerleading competitions, political conventions, thespians and business conventions. It's fun to guess what event is taking place at the Convention Center based upon the clothing of the participants.

Every time I step foot in Curtis Hixon Park, I thank Pam Iorio for this treasure. It is a wonderful gathering place for children, families, yoga, concerts and other outdoor activities. The Straz Center is also a Tampa jewel. Like many of you, my husband and I are subscribers to the Broadway Series and enjoy living close to the theatre. My family loves the Tampa Bay Lightning and attends many hockey games. We belong to a small group of fans in the U.S. who walk to a National Hockey League game from home.
